2025 UNIFOR CONVENTION

Local 506 delegates attended Unifor's 5th Constitutional Convention in Vancouver August 25-29th where "Protect Canadian Jobs" was this year's theme.

Members at Convention re-elected National President Lana Payne and the leadership team, including Atlantic Regional Director, Jennifer Murray. Lana vowed to continue fighting for workers everywhere in Canada.

"We have workers to defend, jobs to protect and a country and economy to get on track. And this country needs us. Canada needs this union. It needs the progressive force that we are," said Payne in her acceptance speech.

Unifor's Atlantic Communications Locals (Locals 401, 410, 506, and 2289) are in negotiations with Bell, fighting for a future where workers are valued assets, not just costs to be cut.

We are the proud workers of Bell Canada in Atlantic Canada. For decades, we have kept our communities, our neighbours, and our families connected. Every day, 1,400 of us give our all to serve this region we love.

But our reality has changed. Our jobs have been disappearing. Our wages are not keeping pace with the rising cost of living. Across Atlantic Canada, rent and home ownership costs have soared, making it harder for working families to make ends meet.

Meanwhile, decisions about our livelihoods are being made in Montreal and Toronto—by people who don't know us, don't live here, and don't understand the realities of life in Atlantic Canada.

Despite this, we have always stepped up. We have shown flexibility, commitment, and dedication to ensure the work gets done.

We are proud Atlantic Canadians. We are the ones who keep Bell's customers connected. And we know that when we stand together, we are **Stronger Together!**

The bargaining committee is focused on securing a fair contract that ensures wages keep up with the rising cost of living, protects jobs, and establishes lasting security for generations of workers.



TRUTH & RECONCILIATION - SEPTEMBER 30TH



September 30 is a national statutory holiday to recognize the widespread abuse at residential schools, honour survivors, and remembers those who did not return home. The event has been known as Orange Shirt Day since 2013, named after the clothing taken from Phyllis (Jack) Webstad when she was six years old on her first day at residential school.



Orange Shirt Day is a time to reflect on the cruel legacy of residential schools, a system supported by governmental and ecclesiastical authorities that sought to assimilate Indigenous children and eradicate their cultures. The statement "Every Child Matters" reaffirms a commitment to recognize the inherent value of every child and the resilience of Indigenous communities that continue to advocate for truth and justice.

Together, let us continue to support the calls for reconciliation and commit to social and political change to honour the spirit and intent of "Every Child Matters."
